Diocese of Plymouth Summer Camps 2024



What are the Summer Camps?

The Diocese of Plymouth has a long tradition of running residentials for the young people of the diocese. Summer Camps were first run in 1952 under the Catholic Women's League, and are now run by a committee of volunteers from across the Diocese.

Each year the camps take on a different catechetical theme - explored through a range of activities such as craft, drama, prayer, music, and time spent in the grounds at Buckfast Abbey.

Summer Camps are a great opportunity to meet other young people in the Diocese and get to know each other through games, quiz nights, treasure hunts, days out and much more!

Age Groups

We run three separate camps for children of different age groups.

- Junior Camp School Years 3 to Year 6
 4th 8th August
- Senior Camp School Years 7 to Year 10
 28th July 2nd August
- St Petroc's Camp School Years 11 and 12 31st July - 2nd August

Accommodation

Each year we stay in Buckfast Abbey's boarding house - Grangehurst. Campers stay in dorms of three to eight with full washing facilities.

We have a large dining room where breakfast, lunch, snacks, and evening meals are provided (included in the cost of the residential).

Grangehurst also has a lounge, prayer area, and lots of outside space.

Our Team

LEADERS

Each residential is lead by a camp organiser and supported by a team of helpers. Team size varies according to the number of campers. All helpers hold full DBS certificates, checked under the Diocesan guidelines

CHAPLAINCY

Catechesis on each camp will be guided by a chaplain who is one of the Priests and Deacons who support the Summer Camps.

HYGIENE AND FIRST AID

Each team has at least one trained First Aider, and helpers serving food hold the relevant Food Hygiene certificates.
